
## RACING SIPUT SOLUTION - ONE PAST / SEE YOU THERE

The grid may be filled as shown. Spaces with circles take one letter from their Crossing clue (shown in the grid), but multiple letters in their respective Lanes (shown to the side of the track). Each of these letter strings, which may span more than one Lane answer, are the name of a family member. These are all of the members of Siput's family tree (names are assigned per their relationship to Siput, and typical family tree conventions regarding gender are used) that have question marks in their boxes. Assigning the Crossing letter to the appropriate family member spells out in the family tree the answer ONE PAST.



All of the one-word Crossing clues are "imposters", or "false friends" from around the world; that is, foreign words that appear to be English words. These are the names of all of Siput's family members that have A-E references given in the family tree. For each such clue, identify the family member and take the letters from that clue's grid answer as indicated by the A-E lane references for that relative in the family tree. In the order of languages as given by the flag layout, these letters spell the answer SEE YOU THERE.

<sup>\*&</sup>quot;Brat" is also Croatian for "brother", but "Sin" is unique to Croatian, so the above is the only way to assign them uniquely.
