

The grid may be filled as in a typical "Cross Sums" or Kakuro puzzle, with the difference that zero may be used. This is necessitated, in fact, by the 10-digit horizontal entries and the 2-digit entries totalling 1.

If one considers "only the pair"s in the grid (reading horizontally), they may be transcribed into letters as shown below, for the final answer LILYPADS.
