

# TRAGEDY TOMORROW - SOLUTION TO LAST ISSUE'S PUZZLE

To properly enter answers in last month's puzzle, any "U" had to be treated as a "V," as seen in many ancient Roman inscriptions. Also, there were ten answers that contained the names of the numbers one through ten. The numbers needed to be converted to their Roman numeral equivalents; for example, **ARTWORK** would be entered as **ARIIRK**, and **JESSE VENTURA** as **JESVIITVRA**. The first and last letters of those clues, ordered by the numbers in their answers, revealed the genre being performed: "A NICE ROME ANTIC COMEDY."
