Once the grid is completed, one may trace the maneuvers of nine different game pieces upon the board. The answers to the clues for each piece, in clue order, form a continuous letter string which indicates its movement from square to square (the word "square" as used herein refers to a black or white region containing a 2x2 block of letters). A piece will start on a square containing the first letter in its string and proceed according to its movement rules to a square containing its second letter, then a square containing its third letter, and so on until all of its answers are spelled out. Each square will be visited by exactly three different pieces, with no individual piece visiting the same square more than once, and with no individual letter in a square being used by more than one piece.

The pieces start on nine different squares which must be determined.

## **PIECES**

PEON - This piece alternates between moving one square forward (up the board) and moving one square to the left or right.



Glutton's extra helpings lead to disaster: splitting shirt embarrassingly (6) Precinct houses recalled with greater accuracy (5)

SCOUT - This piece moves like a modern rook, but only in squares on the perimeter of the board, and without backtracking.



Daughter meeting Indian hero in histrionic scene (5) Crude nut mixture priced lower than competitors (8)

ELEPHANT - This piece moves exactly two squares at a time in any orthogonal or diagonal direction.



Missouri university overused devices installed the wrong way in computer socket (9; 2 wds)

VIZIER - This piece moves any number of squares in any diagonal direction (as a modern Bishop).



Your health starts to seem knotty once ailments linger (5) Don't start reproducing decorative millwork (7)

SULTAN - This piece moves exactly one square in any orthogonal or diagonal direction (as a modern King).



Some correspondance upset Dorothy's aunt earlier (5) Why, lacking closure, I'm thus a little erratic (9)

PAGE - The Sultan's attendant, this piece moves exactly one square in any orthogonal direction.



People who gather about Impressionists (7) Annihilate actress Kirsten heartlessly (4)

KNIGHT - This piece moves three squares in any orthogonal direction, making a right angle turn (exactly as a modern Knight)



Odds of niece being born in Paris (3) Rebuff small companion's insults (5) Delivered bouquet, as discussed (4)

TOWER - This piece moves any number of squares in any orthogonal direction (as a modern Rook).



Raise spirits in seance finally, in the wee hours of the night (5) Yelling, make an example of Spot (4) Very nearly destroy cyclist Costa (3) Most centered of graduates thanks acting teacher Hagen (3)

WIZARD - This powerful piece may mystically transport itself to any square on the board.



Middle of strudel covered with spice mixture gets frosted (6; 2 wds ) Uranium in area warped energy fields (5)
